### Mesoamerica, 2000s BCE-1700s CE

Name	Details
Popul Vuh	A religious-historical text recording the myths and history of the K'iche Mayan people, the source of modern understanding of Mayan religion.
Hero Twins	Hunahpu [hoo-nah-poo] and Xbalanque [sh'bah-lon-kay]. Played the Mesoamerican ball game in Xibalba. Defeated Seven Macaw.
Xibalba	Mayan underworld.
Mayan History	Long Count Calendar. Constructed Chichen Itza.

## **Aztec Myth**

## Mesoamerica, 1300s-1500s

Name	Details
Quetzalcoatl [ket-zal-koh-ah-tul]	The "Feathered Serpent." Enemy of Tezcatlipoca. Traveled to Mictlan with his twin brother, Xolotl and mixed his own blood with the bones of a destroyed world to create a fifth world of humans.
Tezcatlipoca [tets-kot-lee-poh-kah]	Known as the "Smoking Mirror." Enemy of <b>Quetzalcoatl</b> who transformed into a <b>jaguar</b> to destroy the world. After sacrificing his foot, he replaced it with an <b>obsidian</b> mirror.
Xolotl [shoh-lah-tul]	The twin brother of <b>Quetzalcoatl</b> . A psychopomp who guided the dead to <b>Mictlan</b> . God of thunder.
Huitzilopochtli [hweet-zil-oh-pokt-lee]	The "Left-Handed Hummingbird." God of war.
Tlaloc	God of rain.
Mictlan	Aztec underworld.

Name	Details
Viracocha	Creator god.
Manco Cápac	The legndary founder of the Incan Empire, a descendent of Viracocha.
Inti	Sun god.
Incan History	Capital at Cuzco.
